President's Message by Gary Little

Take a close look at this small sheet of five of the 3c olive green Charlotte definitive stamp of 1921 that I recently acquired — it is mint never hinged with the usual mottled gum of the era. Have you ever seen one before? I certainly hadn't — and since it's not listed in Scott or in the specialized Prifix catalog, I'm guessing that very few people are even aware of it.

Luxembourg did issue a similar sheet of five of the 15c rose value on January 6, 1921 to celebrate the birth of the future Grand Duke Jean (Scott 125a; Prifix Feuillet No. 1), but that sheet was wider, included a serial number in the upper right, and the perforated initials "CC" in the lower right. Although special sheets of 25 of the 3c, 6c, 20c, 75c, and 80c values were also issued later, all the stamps in this series were normally printed in sheets of 100.

My 3c sheet of five is undoubtedly an unissued proof. The fact that it is not mentioned in Prifix is a bit of a mystery, however, since proofs for several other issues are listed and valued. Perhaps one of our readers can provide more information about this sheet and other unlisted proofs that may exist for this first series of Charlotte definitive stamps.
